LIEUTENANT COLONEL (Dr.) JAY E. FANDEL

Lt Col (Doctor) Jay E. Fandel is the Oral Surgery Element Chief, 42d Aeromedical Squadron, 42d Medical Group, Maxwell AFB, AL. As a dental provider, he is responsible for providing world class dental care to the 42d Air Base Wing and all its components to include Air Force, Army, Navy and Reserve Units. Dr. Fandel is credentialed in IV Sedation and is an ACLS instructor.

Lt Col Fandel attended The University of Mississippi, from 1983 to 1986 where he earned a Bachelor of Science degree. He entered the Air Force Dental Corps in July 1991 after receiving his DMD from the University of Mississippi, Jackson. While stationed at Andersen AFB, Guam he participated in Operation Pacific Haven and Super Typhoon Paka Humanitarian efforts. He was appointed as OIC of GSUs for 52FW Spangdahlem, Germany which included the Air Forces' only dental treatment vehicle. He deployed to Romania in July 2000 for a multi-national force exercise where he had the opportunity to employ the Expeditionary Medical Service equipment package in its 1st operational field evaluation. He deployed to Camp Sather, Baghdad, Iraq July 2003 as 477th EMEDS Chief of Dental Services where he played a key role in the forensic identification of Uday & Qusay Hussain and other high ranking BAATH party members and responded to numerous mass casualty events including the UN bombing in Baghdad. After completing the AEGD-1 residency at Offutt AFB, NE in 2005, Lt Col Fandel assumed command of the 17th MDG Dental Flight, Goodfellow AFB, TX where he was instrumental in utilizing civilian dentists with AF funding to examine and treat incoming Intel students. In 2006, Goodfellow met AF metrics for the first time ever and the program was commended by AETC/SGD. He was next stationed at Spangdahlem AB, Germany as the sole Oral Surgery provider and #1 producer of 15 dentist clinic. From Jun11 to Feb12, he stepped in as the 42nd Chief of Dental Services during Col Wallace's 6 month deployment and then returned to full time patient care after his returned. Dr. Fandel retired on 1 November 2013 after 22 years of service.

Lt Col Fandel is married to the former Ms. Frances H Vargas on 5 Jun 2008. He has a 9 year old son Nicholas and 6 year old daughter Lauren. He also shares 3 step-sons, 25 year old Jaymie, 21 year old Dylan and 20 year old Marc with his wife Frances.
